2022 World AIDS Day HIV Symposium to be held in Lindi Region, Tanzania 28 -29 November 2022 at hotel Seaview Beach Resort

The 2022 World AIDS Day HIV Symposium theme is "EQUALIZE"

The Tanzania Commission for AIDS (TACAIDS) under the leadership of the Prime Minister's Office is responsible for coordination, resource mobilization, monitoring and evaluation of the national multisectoral HIV response. TACAIDS aims to facilitate dissemination and sharing of HIV and AIDS information and experience among stakeholders to enhance data driven implementation of effective HIV interventions. It is against this background, TACAIDS in collaboration with different HIV stakeholders has been organizing a national HIV Symposium every year during the week of commemorations of the WORLD AIDS DAY.

The Honourable Prime Minister of the United Republic of Tanzania, Hon. Kassim Majaliwa Majaliwa, is the invited Guest of Honor for the event which includes key note speakers from TACAIDS, Ministry of Health, President's Office Regional Administration and Local Government, UNAIDS Country Representative and PEPFAR Country Coordinator. This year's HIV symposium will feature a series of presentations followed by interactive plenary discussions.

TACAIDS is calling for HIV and AIDS stakeholders to submit HIV and AIDS related abstracts for presentation during the HIV Symposium themed "EQUALIZE". Areas of interest for the oral or poster abstracts include the following: -
